The Board of Directors has approved repairs to sidewalks that pose a trip hazard. Work is underway now.

Vents to Attics and Crawlspaces Recently several owners at Millridge have discovered the vents that are fanned above the kitchen cooking surfaces and bathrooms are venting into attics and crawlspaces. Worse - we have seen clothes dryers venting there too. This is imposing a couple of serious risks: mold, and lint-fire.

In some cases a new roof was put on a building, and the vents were not reconnected, so the fumes could pass through. This was not shown as part of the Scope-of-Work in the contracts for the new roofs.

After conferring with our law firm, we realize that the responsibility for reattaching vent pipes rests with the homeowner. Please take the time to look into your attic to insure that your vents are connected. If they are not, you need to have that work done.
